Registration 2005-2006

I am pleased to send out this update on Registration for the upcoming academic year 2005-2006.

New sections of courses have been added to the WebAdvisor list and have been available for registration. The total number of seats in courses available to students has increased this year over last year. The temporary restrictions on the number of seats available in introductory courses have been removed after the two-week July registration for incoming new students. Courses are open in all disciplines and in the special areas of Catholic Studies, Environmental Studies, Fine Arts, Great Ideas, Irish Studies, and Japanese. You are encouraged to review your options in WebAdvisor.

We do not anticipate many more changes to the number of courses or sections to be offered. Names of instructors will be added to the WebAdvisor list as they are confirmed. There are many new courses especially in the Department of History and in the new area of Fine Arts. In the case of History, please be aware that students do not need an introductory level history as a prerequisite in order to enroll in 2000 level history courses.. In the case of Fine Arts (FNAR), the University has introduced 9 sections of FNAR courses in the first semester and 8 sections in the second semester. Students are encouraged to register in one of these sections.

Registration will continue up to September 16, 2005 for the first semester and January 13, 2006 for the second semester. Remember that you must have confirmed arrangements for payment of tuition fees by September 14, 2005 in order to keep the courses registered. Students are welcome to make payments and arrangements at the Registrar's office now to avoid the rush in September. We have heard from the New Brunswick Student Aid department and expect the New Brunswick Loan certificates in our office by August 22, 2005.
