UPS Canada Ltd. Bursary

Value: \$500. One bursary to be awarded annually to a full-time student enrolled in third or fourth year of an undergraduate programme. Selection will be based on academic achievement (minimum annual gpa of 3.0 on a minimum of 30 credit hours), financial need and demonstrated involvement in the University and/or local community. Donor: UPS Canada Ltd., Canada Brokerage, Fredericton, N.B. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Rev. Richard O'Brien Waugh, C.S.C., Scholarship

Value: Variable (\$1000 maximum). Awarded annually. This scholarship honors the memory of Father Waugh of the Holy Cross Fathers who taught Philosophy at St. Thomas from 1964-1986. Open to all students, except those in first year, enrolled in Arts and Social Work. Selection criteria are based on academic achievement and financial need. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

B. Bursaries and Loans

Student Loans

1. Canada Student Loan – A loan, repayable with interest, funded by the Federal Government and administered by the New Brunswick Department of Advanced Education and Labour. To be eligible for this assistance, you must be enrolled in a minimum of 60% of a full-time course load. (See 5.o)
2. New Brunswick Student Loan – A loan, repayable with interest, funded by the Province of New Brunswick. You may qualify for this assistance if the Canada student Loan does not fully cover your costs and you are enrolled in a minimum of 60% of a full-time course load.
3. New Brunswick Bursary - A non-repayable grant. You must first qualify for the maximum amount available through Canada and New Brunswick Student Loans. The amount of the bursary differs depending upon your marital status and number of dependents. To qualify, you must be registered in a minimum 80% of a full-time course load.
4. In order for students to take full advantage of the total student aid programme (Canada Loan, New Brunswick Loan, New Brunswick Bursary), they must be registered in a minimum of 60% of a full-time course load (3 out of 5 classes) – in both semesters.
5. St. Thomas Student Aid Office – The Student Aid Office at St. Thomas is in the Registrar's Office, George Martin Hall. Applications for full and part-time students are available. Information and assistance available to all students.

7. University Bursaries

In addition to other bursaries available, St. Thomas students are eligible for the following:

Fenton Burke Memorial Bursary

Value: \$1000. One bursary will be awarded annually in memory of Fenton Burke, who was a member of the Department of English from 1963 until his death in 2001, and who served as Chair from 1990 until 2001. The bursary will be awarded to a student who has completed third year (or a minimum of 90 credit hours), and is majoring in English. Preference will be given to students who do not already hold a scholarship or bursary. Eligibility will be determined primarily by financial need, but a minimum gpa of 3.0 is required. Priority will be given to students from Cape Breton. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Colter Family Bursaries

Value: \$500. Five bursaries awarded annually to students in financial need who demonstrate good academic standing. Preferred distribution of the bursaries is to full-time students in the following programmes: one for criminology, two for education (one for a mature student), two for social work (one for a mature student). Donors: The Colter Family. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Diocesan Bursaries

Bursaries and scholarships, not specifically designated for St. Thomas University, are frequently available from societies and agencies at the diocesan level. Application for such grants should be made to the sponsoring agency at the local level.

Thomas W. Donovan Memorial Bursary

Value: \$500. One bursary awarded annually in the second semester to a student in the professional years of the Bachelor of Social Work or Bachelor of Education Programmes. Selection criteria will include financial need and demonstrated involvement in extracurricular activities (athletics and/or community). Preference will be given to an applicant from the Miramichi. Donors: Friends and family of Tom Donovan. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Faculty Fund Bursaries

The Faculty Fund is made up of contributions from the faculty and administration of St. Thomas

University. Each term a number of bursaries will be awarded to students in need of financial assistance who show reasonable academic achievement, and are enrolled either full time or part time in the BA, BSW, or BEd Programmes at St. Thomas University. Apply: Chair, Faculty Fund Committee.

The Fredericton Community Foundation Tuition Bursary

To be awarded on the basis of financial need to a full-time campus student who is a graduate of a Fredericton High School and is entering the third full year of a degree programme. The recipient must have demonstrated successful academic performance. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Provincial Chapter of New Brunswick I.O.D.E. Bursary

Value: \$150. Awarded to female students entering their second year at St. Thomas University. Selection criteria will include financial need as well as grades. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Abdul Lodhi Bursary

Value: \$500. This bursary is named in honour of the late Dr. Abdul Lodhi, professor of sociology, human rights educator and researcher, and founder of the Atlantic Human Rights Centre. It is awarded to a full-time student who is a single parent, and who is in second year or beyond. Though the sole criterion is financial need, applicants must have achieved a GPA of at least 2.3 in their last full year of study. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Louisbourg Investments Bursaries

Value: \$1000. Two bursaries to be awarded on the basis of demonstrated financial need to students entering third or fourth year and who are majoring in Economics. Donor: Louisbourg Investments. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Millennium Bursary

Established in January 2000, the Millennium Bursary Programme, value \$500, has been funded by donations from alumni, faculty, staff, and friends of St. Thomas University. The primary objective is to provide financial assistance to students in financial need. Bursaries, number to be determined on a year-to-year basis, will be awarded annually to students registered full time at the University. Selection will be made on the basis of financial information provided by the Canada Student Loan Assessment or its equivalent. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University, by November 1.

Debbie Nason Social Work Bursary

Value: \$500. A minimum of one bursary to be awarded annually to a student in the professional years of the Bachelor of Social Work Programme. Preference will be given to students in financial need, who have an interest in the field of health care, and are residents of the area served by the Dr. Everett Chalmers Regional Hospital. Donors: Family, colleagues, and friends of Debbie Nason. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

NBTel Mobility Freedom Fund Bursary

Value: \$1000. One bursary to be awarded annually to a full-time student enrolled in second, third, or fourth year of an undergraduate degree programme. Will be awarded on the basis of academic achievement (minimum 3.0 average), financial need, and demonstrated involvement in extracurricular activities (university and/or community). Other conditions apply: (1) Employees or children of employees of any NBTel affiliate are not eligible, and (2) successful recipient should not have been awarded any major scholarship(s). Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Monsignor O'Hanley Bursaries

Funded in 1982, five bursaries at \$500 per annum will be awarded annually. Academic performance as well as need will be taken into consideration. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

William J. Oxendale Memorial Bursary

Value: \$1000. One bursary awarded annually to a third or fourth-year student with a Major in the Human Rights Programme. The recipient must have maintained a grade point average equal to a B+ or higher and not be in receipt of any other University award. Donors: Mackin and Eileen Oxendale. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Ladies Auxiliary Command Royal Canadian Legion Bursaries

Value: \$200. Number: 6. Available to students in the Province of New Brunswick. Donor: Ladies Auxiliary Command, Royal Canadian Legion. Apply: Mrs. Betty MacDougall, 157 Orange St., Saint John, N.B., E2L 1M7.

St. Dunstan's Parish CWL Bursary

Value: \$500. One year, renewable. Among the criteria considered are: scholastic achievement, financial need. Preference will be given to a resident of Fredericton. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Ste. Anne's Point Chapter Bursary

Minimum value: \$200. Awarded in alternate years for one year. Awarded on the basis of academic performance and financial need to a full-time St. Thomas student who is entering the penultimate or final year of an undergraduate degree programme. Donor: Saint Anne's Point Chapter IODE. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Scoudouc River Continuing Education Award: Part-time Students

Field of study unrestricted, tenable only at post-secondary institutions in New Brunswick. These awards are intended for part-time students and are open to persons residing in New Brunswick who were not engaged in full-time study during the twelve-month period preceding the date of application. The minimum value of this award is \$100 per course, and its maximum value is \$300 per course. No one may receive more than one of these awards in any calendar year. The donor is the late Dr. William L. Webster. Application forms can be obtained from the Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University. The completed forms should be returned to that office. Awards are made in the middle of the months of October, February, May, and July; applications should be made respectively before September 15, January 15, April 15, and June 15. Applications will be considered by the Scoudouc River continuing education awards selection committee.

Bursary for Senior Citizens

St. Thomas University has a limited amount of bursary assistance for senior citizens who lack the financial resources to comply with the University's tuition fee policy. Such students should submit an application for bursary assistance to the Registrar's Office. The application should be supported by a statement of the applicant's financial position and information regarding income sources and expenditure requirements. A maximum of \$1,500 is available for this bursary programme.

William A. 'Doc' Spray Bursary

Value: \$400. One bursary to be awarded annually to a full-time student enrolled in the third year of a degree programme. The recipient must have demonstrated successful academic performance and be in financial need. Donor: Dr. Bill Spray, Professor Emeritus. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Sherry Lynn Taylor Memorial Bursary

Value: \$500. One bursary awarded annually to a student in the professional years of the Bachelor of Social Work Degree Programme. Selection is based on financial need and a

combination of: 1) an expressed interest in child and family well-being; 2) community services; 3)extracurricular activities. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

TD Bank Financial Group Bursaries

Value: \$500 minimum. Awarded annually to students in financial need. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

C. Dean's List

The Dean's List honours those full-time students in Arts and Social Work who in the preceding academic year (September-April) achieved a grade point average of 3.70 or better on a minimum of 30 credit hours.

D. University Medal

The University Medal is the highest award offered by the University itself. The medals are made possible through an endowment created by President O'Brien and his family. Three medals are awarded annually to the outstanding graduate in the arts, education, and social work programmes. The arts medal is awarded at the spring convocation; the education and social work medals at the summer convocation. The selection of medal winners is made by the Vice-President (Academic) on the recommendation of the Registrar.
