A. Scholarships

St. Thomas University recognizes academic excellence through a generous scholarship programme. The university offers a wide range of entrance awards to highly qualified students admitted on the basis of their high school records, as well as numerous scholarships-in-course to continuing students who have achieved academic distinction at St. Thomas.

Entrance Scholarships

The Entrance Scholarship Programme is highly competitive and is designed to attract outstanding scholars to the St. Thomas University campus. Except when otherwise specified, the entrance awards are open to candidates for full-time admission to the first year of the Bachelor of Arts Programme who are applying on the basis of their high school records.

1. Selection Criteria

In selecting entrance scholarship recipients, the primary criterion considered by the Entrance Scholarship Selection Committee is the academic record. The Committee reviews the following:

- admission average
- Grade 12 programme: courses and levels
- rank in graduating class
- programme and performance in grade 11

Note: The admission average is calculated on the senior-level academic English grade and the grades on four other Grade 12 academic courses drawn from our list of approved admissions subjects. For details, please consult Section One, Admissions and Registration. At mid year, the admission averages for scholarship purposes is calculated on the overall average of final grades on Grade 11 academic subjects, as well as final first-semester results or mid-year results (for non-semestered schools) on Grade 12 academic subjects.

Other factors considered include:

- letters of academic reference (optional)
- scores on standardized tests, including provincial achievement examinations

In addition to the academic selection criteria, the following criteria are considered in awarding some entrance scholarships:

- leadership qualities
- extracurricular activities
- financial status

2. *Application Procedure*

Candidates for full-time admission to the BA Programme on the St. Thomas University campus who maintain an admission average of 80% or higher, are automatically considered for entrance scholarships. However, scholarship candidates are encouraged to submit to the Admissions Office a completed scholarship application form providing a brief overview of academic Honours, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, and other qualifications for entrance awards. A letter of reference may also be submitted. Application materials submitted to the Admissions Office will also be reviewed by the Entrance Scholarship Selection Committee.

3. *Application Deadline*

The application deadline for major renewable scholarships is March 1 and scholarship offers are announced by April 15. Recipients have until May 15 to confirm acceptance of scholarships by submitting a \$100 advance payment on tuition. Scholarship applications received after the March 1 deadline are reviewed on an individual basis and scholarships may be offered, conditional on the availability of awards. Guaranteed annual awards are offered throughout the admissions cycle (September – August).

4. *List of Entrance Scholarships*

Among the Entrance Scholarships tenable at St. Thomas University are the following:

Aliant Telecom Scholarship

Valued at full-tuition (\$3915 for 2004-2005), plus a \$400 allotment for textbooks. Renewable at the annual value of full tuition for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. One scholarship awarded annually to a graduate of a New Brunswick high school. Scholastic attainment is the primary selection criterion, with consideration given to financial need. Donor: Aliant Telecom. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Bahamas Entrance Scholarship

Valued at tuition plus international differential fees (\$7830 for 2004-2005) and renewable for three more years with a minimum annual average of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Open to nominees of the Lyford Kay Foundation. Selection criteria include academic excellence and leadership qualities.

Bishop Barry Entrance Scholarship

Valued at \$1000 and guaranteed as a minimum amount to Canadian citizens with a first-semester or final admissions average between 85% and 89%. This scholarship honors the memory of Bishop Thomas F. Barry, founder of St. Thomas University, Chatham, N.B., 1910. Donors: priests of the Diocese of Saint John and other friends. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Bishop Bray Foundation Scholarships

Valued at \$500 per annum and renewable for three more years with a minimum annual average of 3.3 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Four scholarships awarded annually to graduating high school students from the Diocese of Saint John, N.B. Selection is based upon academic achievement, leadership and financial need. Donor: The Bishop Bray Foundation. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Chancellor's Scholarship

Valued at the total annual costs of full tuition and single room and board plus a \$500 book allowance (approximately \$11,445 for 2004-2005). Renewable for three additional years with a minimum annual average on 30 credit hours of 3.7, the scholarship is indexed to increases in tuition and single room and board. One scholarship awarded annually to a student of outstanding academic ability and achievement entering first year. Selection will be based on academic excellence, with attention given to qualities of leadership and versatility. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Chancellor's International Scholarships

Valued at full international tuition (\$7830 in 2004-2005) and renewable for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.7 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Open to top-ranking international students entering first year. Selection will be based on academic excellence, with attention given to leadership qualities. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Commonwealth of Dominica Entrance Scholarship

Value: Tuition plus international differential fees (approximately \$7830 for 2004-2005). One scholarship awarded annually to an entering student who is a citizen of the Commonwealth of Dominica. Renewable for second year with a minimum annual gpa of 3.0 on a minimum of 30 credit hours and renewable for third and fourth years with a minimum gpa of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Selection will be based on demonstrated academic ability, leadership qualities, with financial need also being taken into account. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Sherman Donovan Scholarship

Valued at \$2500. Two entrance scholarships awarded annually to honour the memory of parents Robert and Mary, and brother Raymond Donovan. Selection criteria will include scholastic achievement and financial need. Preference is given to applicants from Northumberland County, but limited to graduates of the schools included in School District 16: Blackville School, James M. Hill Memorial High School, Miramichi Valley High School, and North and South Esk Regional High School. Donor: Sherman Donovan. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Claire M. Elhatton Scholarship

Valued at \$3000 and awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement and financial need to an entering student from the Miramichi-Bathurst area. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

John and Viola Fleming Scholarship

Valued at \$400 and awarded annually to a qualified entering candidate from St. Agnes Parish, Debec, N.B. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Fredericton Foundation Scholarships

Valued at \$500 per annum. Two scholarships to residents of the city of Fredericton entering St. Thomas. Selections are made primarily on the basis of scholastic attainment and financial need. Consideration will be given to contribution to extracurricular activities. Donor: The Fredericton Foundation Inc. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Rev. Raymond Hawkes Scholarship

Valued at \$600 per annum and renewable for three more years with a minimum annual average of 3.3 on 30 credit hours. The scholarship is named for the first diocesan rector of St. Thomas. Selection criteria include character, leadership, and high scholastic standing in one of the various Miramichi area high schools. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Cornelius and Katherine Kingston Memorial Scholarship

Valued at \$500. Selection is based on scholastic achievement and financial need, with attention

to extracurricular activities. Preference will be given to students from the North Esk-Newcastle area. Donors: members of the Kingston family. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Rev. T.A. MacDonald Scholarship

Valued at \$1000 in first year, the scholarship honors the memory of the Rev. Thomas A. MacDonald, C.S.B., native of Auburnville, N.B., and long-time Basilian priest and educator. Selection criteria include scholastic achievement and financial need. This award is renewable for three additional years at \$750 per annum with a minimum annual average of 3.3 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Preference is given to applicants from the Miramichi. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Monsignor George W. Martin Scholarship

Valued at the total annual costs of full tuition and double room and board (approximately \$9495 for 2004-2005). Renewable for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.7 on a minimum of 30 credit hours, the scholarship is indexed to increases in tuition and double room and board. Two scholarships awarded annually to students of outstanding academic ability and achievement. Selection will be based on academic excellence, with attention given to qualities of leadership and versatility. This award honors Monsignor George W. Martin, an alumnus who served the University with distinction for 41 years and was its president from 1975 to 1990. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Harrison McCain Scholarships

Valued at \$13,500 over four years: \$5000 in year one, \$3500 in year 2, \$2500 per annum in years three and four. Open to Canadian high school graduates, selection criteria include admissions average of 80% or higher, financial need, recognized initiative in funding university education and leadership qualities. Donor: the Harrison McCain Foundation. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University (separate application form required).

Francis M. McLaughlin Scholarships

Valued at full tuition plus \$1000 (\$4915 in 2004-2005), and renewable for three more years with a minimum annual average of 3.7 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Open to students of outstanding academic ability and achievement entering first year. Academic excellence will be the sole basis of selection. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Rev. Bernard McMahon Scholarship

Valued at \$2000 in first year, the award is renewable at the annual value of full tuition for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. This scholarship honors the memory of Father Bernard McMahon, late pastor of St. Gertrude's Church, Woodstock, N.B. Among the selection criteria considered are academic achievement and financial need. Preference is given to applicants from Carleton County. Donors: Dr. Jed Sutherland and Mr. Harrison McCain. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Timmy Munn Memorial Scholarships

Valued at \$800. Three scholarships will be awarded annually in memory of Timmy Munn, who died tragically in January 1995. Scholarships awarded on the basis of athletic ability, academic performance, and financial need. At least one recipient will have a demonstrated ability in hockey as a player, coach, manager, or on-ice official. Recipients will have graduated from a local high school and attend a local college or university. Include an official transcript with letter of application. Application deadline: June 30. Donor: Fredericton Police/Old Timers Bursaries and the Catherine Karnes Munn Scholarships. Apply: Fredericton Sports Investment (1990) Inc., 117 York St., Fredericton, N.B. E3B 3N6

Pepsi Scholarships

Valued at \$2500 and open to graduates from New Brunswick high schools. Two scholarships

awarded annually on the basis of scholastic attainment. Donor: Pepsi Bottling Group (Canada). Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

President's Scholarships

Valued at full tuition (\$3915 for 2004-2005) and renewable for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. The value at renewal is indexed to annual increases in tuition. Open to top-ranking students entering first year. Academic excellence is the sole selection criterion. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

President's International Scholarships

Valued at half of annual full international tuition (\$3915 in 2004-2005) and renewable for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. Open to top-ranking international students entering first year. Academic excellence is the sole selection criterion. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Adult Learners – Katherine Louise Roderick Scholarship

Value: \$1500. One scholarship to be awarded annually to a full-time student. This scholarship Honours the memory of Katherine Louise Roderick, a student at St. Thomas University from 1966-70. Open to women entering first year under the Adult Learner admissions policy. Selection will be made in January and will be based on semester one grades. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

St. Thomas Advantage Scholarships

Valued at \$500 and guaranteed as a minimum amount to applicants with first semester or final admissions averages between 80% and 84%. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

St. Thomas Scholars Awards

Valued at \$2000 (\$1500 in first year and \$500 in second) and guaranteed as a minimum amount to applicants with first-semester or final admissions averages of 90% or higher. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Evelyn Sweezy Scholarship

Valued at full tuition (\$3915 for 2004-2005) and renewable for three additional years with a minimum annual average of 3.5 on a minimum of 30 credit hours. The value at renewal is indexed to annual increases in tuition. One scholarship annually awarded to a top-ranking entering student with particular strength in English literature and active in extracurricular activities. Preference will be given to candidates with interest in theatre, oratory, debate, or writing.

Entering Students – The Vance Toner Hockey Scholarship

Valued at full tuition (\$3915 in 2004-2005), this scholarship honors Vance Toner, a former Athletic Director at St. Thomas, and is offered to entering students who combine high academic achievement (as defined by the Admissions Office) with athletic ability in the area of hockey. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

York Funeral Home Scholarship

Value: \$1000. One scholarship awarded annually to an entering student who is a graduate of Leo Hayes High School. Selection criteria will include demonstrated academic success and student leadership. Donor: The MacLeod Family. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

5. Entrance Bursary

Harry Brown and Bessie Brown Bursary

Valued at \$500. One bursary open to a Fredericton resident entering the one-year Post-Degree Bachelor of Social Work Degree Programme. Donor: The estate of Harry Brown. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Eugene T. McCarthy Memorial Bursary

Value: \$1000. Five bursaries to be awarded annually in memory of Eugene McCarthy to graduates of New Brunswick high schools entering university. Selection criteria: financial need and academic promise. Donor: Mrs. Verna McCarthy. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Geoffrey W. Vail Bursary

Value: \$1000. One bursary awarded annually to a student entering university under the mature student admissions policy. Among the selection criteria are financial need and the potential for contributing to the quality of student life or activities. Selection will be made in January. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Andrew H. Williams Insurance Bursary

Value: \$2000. One bursary to be awarded annually to a graduate of Leo Hayes High School who is entering a degree programme at St. Thomas University. The recipient must have demonstrated successful academic performance and be in financial need. Consideration will be given to the candidate's involvement in athletics and the community. Donor: Andrew H. Williams. Apply: Admissions Office, St. Thomas University.

Scholarships-in-Course

Scholarships-in-course are open to returning students who have demonstrated academic excellence in their course of studies. Candidates should submit the following to the Awards Officer: a completed scholarship application form, a letter of academic reference, and a brief overview of educational background, academic awards and accomplishments.

The following is the list of scholarships-in-course tenable at St. Thomas:

ATV Media Scholarship

Value: \$6000. The scholarship is to be awarded to a student entering the third year of the Journalism Programme who is a member of a designated group as defined in the Canada Employment Equity Act with preference given to a student who is a member of a visible minority or the aboriginal peoples, who demonstrates an interest in television Journalism. If a candidate from one of the designated groups is not available, the University reserves the right to identify other deserving candidates. Donor: ATV/CTV Television.

Bernard and Louis Bloomfield Scholarship

Value: \$200 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Suzie Breau Memorial Scholarship

Valued at \$500 per annum, the scholarship is open to a third-year student who plans to make a career of caring for the aged and is enrolling in courses in Gerontology. The award, established by the family of the late Suzie Breau, Class of 1991, honours her memory. Applicants are invited to write a letter of application to Mrs. Breau outlining their plans and aspirations in respect to the study of Gerontology. Richard Dean Brown Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$700 per annum. Open to undergraduate students who demonstrate academic merit and an interest in the study of human rights. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University. (Note: The recipient of this scholarship will be selected by the Awards Officer in consultation with the Director of the Atlantic Human Rights Centre.)

J.E.P. Butler Scholarship

Value: \$300 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Rev. Edmund Casey Scholarship

Value: \$100. Awarded annually to a resident of Harrington Hall registered at St. Thomas University. Selection criteria will be scholastic achievement and contribution to the quality of life in residence. Donor: Harrington Hall House Committee. Apply: Harrington Hall House Committee.

Rev. Edmund J. Casey Memorial Scholarship

Value: minimum \$1000 per annum. The Faculty Fund Committee, on behalf of the Faculty members contributing to the Fund, awards this scholarship. It is given to a returning student who has demonstrated not only academic distinction (a gpa above 3.5), but also high character and leadership within the St. Thomas community. Information concerning this award is posted in the fall semester. Apply: Chair, Faculty Fund Committee.

Louis Chabot Scholarship

Valued at \$1500 per annum and renewable, this scholarship honours the memory of Louis Chabot, a former Dean's List student and member of the varsity hockey team who died unexpectedly in March 1990, and is offered annually to returning students who have participated in intercollegiate hockey and who have maintained a minimum average of B- during their last session as a full time student. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Commcorp Financial Services Inc. Scholarship

Value: \$250 per annum. Open to any undergraduate student who shows academic promise and who is in need of financial assistance. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Senator John J. Connolly Scholarship

Value: \$200. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Honoria Conway Scholarship Fund

For lay women involved in ministry, a number of scholarships are available. For information about eligibility and application write: Scholarship Committee, Sisters of Charity of the I.C., Box Z66, Saint John, N.B., E2L 3V1.

Monsignor W.J. Conway Scholarship

Value: \$200 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Preference to a Madawaska County student. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Dr. Richard W. Costello Scholarship

Value: Minimum \$1000. One scholarship awarded annually, on the basis of academic achievement and financial need, to an anthropology student entering the fourth year of study. Donor: the estate of Dr. Richard Costello. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Senator David A. Croll Scholarship

Value: \$500 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually to a student enrolled in the social sciences or social work. Among the selection criteria are: academic excellence, financial need, qualities of leadership. Donor: Senator David A. Croll, Ottawa, Ontario. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Cornelius E. and Annie Crowley Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$2500 minimum. One scholarship to be awarded annually to a third or fourth-year student honoring or majoring in Religious Studies. Selection criteria will include financial need as well as academic achievement. Donor: The late Elizabeth Ann Crowley in memory of her parents. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Professor Ted Daigle Memorial Scholarships

Value: \$500-\$1000. Awarded annually in memory of Professor Ted Daigle who taught at St. Thomas University from 1966 until his death in 1983. The scholarships are open to students pursuing studies in French (Second Language) and/or Drama. Scholastic achievement and need are included in the selection criteria. Apply: Chair, Faculty Fund Committee.

Rev. Thomas J. Daley Memorial Scholarship

Awarded annually by the St. Thomas University Alumni Association in honour of the late Thomas J. Daley, BA '59 and Director of Alumni from 1982 to 1987. Value varies with investment earnings. Awarded during semester two to a St. Thomas University student who is actively involved in campus ministry and who demonstrates academic achievement. Selection criteria include musical ability, academic performance and financial need. Apply: Alumni Affairs Officer, St. Thomas University.

Datatel Scholars Foundation Scholarships

Value: \$700 per annum. Open to full-time and part-time (six hours minimum) students. Funded by the Datatel Scholars Foundation. Apply for further information and forms by January 15, to the Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Juergen Doerr History Scholarship

Value: \$1000. One scholarship awarded annually to a second, third, or fourth-year student majoring in History. The recipient must have maintained an annual grade point average of 3.3 or higher. Selection will be based on academic achievement and financial need. Donor: Uta Doerr. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Dr. D. Leo Dolan Scholarship

Value: \$200. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

M. Monica Donoghue Scholarship

Value: \$400 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement and financial need. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Alice Doyle Memorial Scholarship

Value: approximately \$500. One scholarship to be awarded annually. Open to a mature student enrolled in second, third, or fourth year. The principal criteria are initiative and need. Donor: the family of Mrs. Alice Doyle. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Monsignor Donald C. Duffie Scholarship

Value: \$500 awarded annually. This award is open to applicants who belong to the University band, The Thomists. Selection is made on the basis of satisfactory academic performance and leadership in band activities. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Monsignor Donald C. Duffie Memorial Scholarships

Value: \$1000 - \$1500. Awarded annually to returning students in memory of Monsignor Donald C. Duffie, president of the University, 1961-75. Among the selection criteria are: character, academic achievement, and contribution to student life. These scholarships are supported by the Duffie Endowment Fund, established, May 1989. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Duffie Scholarships: Part-Time Students

Value: \$150-\$300. A number of scholarships, named in honour of Monsignor Donald C. Duffie, former president of the University. Eligibility: part-time students who have completed a minimum of three full courses, or equivalent. Selection will be made on the

basis of academic achievement, with attention given to financial need. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Leo Francis and Millicent Ferrari Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$500. One scholarship to be awarded annually to a mature student, in third or fourth year, who is honouring or majoring in Philosophy. Financial need as well as academic achievement will be a criterion. Donor: Dr. Leo Charles Ferrari. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Grogan-Pace Scholarship

Value: \$500 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually. Selection criteria include academic achievement and financial need. Preference will be given to prospective candidates for the priesthood. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Rev. George J. Harrington Scholarship

Value: \$600 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

The Gene Hayes Scholarship

Purpose: The Gene Hayes Scholarship Fund provides approximately \$4000 per year support to students with disabilities who require funding to meet a unique learning need which is a result of their disability.

Eligibility: All applicants for the Gene Hayes Scholarship must have a sound academic record. Students with a disability who require support services (e.g. text readers or note takers) or, specialized materials and equipment to provide greater learning accessibility are encouraged to apply. Standard educational costs (e.g. tuition or textbooks) and regular living expenses (e.g. rent or food) are not eligible for support.

Amount of Award: The Gene Hayes Scholarship Fund seeks to provide funding to cover the cost of the additional services, materials or equipment required by the student to meet his or her unique learning needs. Normally, a recipient of the Gene Hayes Scholarship will not receive more than \$1000 in any given academic year.

Application Procedures: Applicants must complete "The Gene Hayes Scholarship Application Form" and submit it to: Director of Student Affairs, St. Thomas University, Fredericton, New Brunswick, E3B 5G3. The deadline for receipt of applications is September 1, however, applications will be accepted through the academic year provided that there are monies available in the scholarship fund.

Holy Cross Fathers Scholarship in Catholic Studies

Value: \$1000. Awarded annually. This scholarship honours the religious members of the Congregation of Holy Cross appointed to St. Thomas in various capacities since 1964. Open to students in third and fourth year who are majoring in Catholic Studies. Selection criteria: academic achievement with an annual gpa of 3.0 or higher and financial need. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

St. Thomas Intercollegiate Athletics Awards

Value varies to a maximum of full-tuition and compulsory fees. These awards are offered to full-time students who have completed two successful semesters and are involved in Canadian Interuniversity Sport (CIS) athletics. Student athletes must have maintained satisfactory grades during their last session as a full-time student. Awarded by the Awards Officer after nominations from the Athletic Department.

Dick and Judy Kennedy Scholarship in English

Value: \$500 per annum. One scholarship to be awarded annually to a student entering third or fourth year with a Major or honours in English. Selection will be based on academic

achievement and financial need. Donors: Dick and Judy Kennedy. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Knights of Columbus Scholarship

Value: \$500 per annum. One scholarship per annum open to students from any diocese of the Province of New Brunswick who are registered full-time at the University. Selection criteria include academic achievement, financial need and potential for contributing to the mission of St. Thomas University. Mrs. P.M. McMahon Scholarship

Value: \$500 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Open scholarship. Moncton student preferred. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Senator Donald A. McLean Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$1000 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually. Selection is based on scholastic achievement and financial need. Preference will be given to returning full-time students who have graduated from New Brunswick high schools. Donated by the late Catherine Mary McLean in memory of her late husband, Senator Donald A. McLean, LLD (STU 1972). Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Dr. Marguerite Michaud Scholarship

Value: \$300 per annum. One scholarship awarded annually on the basis of academic achievement. Apply: Registrar's Office, St. Thomas University.

Bertha L. Miller Memorial Scholarship

Value: \$500 per annum. Open to graduating students who demonstrate academic merit and who have been accepted to postgraduate studies. Outstanding Scholar Award

Value: \$1000 per annum. One hundred scholarships-in-course. Open to returning full-time students who have demonstrated academic excellence in their course of studies. Students eligible for the competition for this limited number of scholarships will be considered under the following criteria:

- 1) In the year of application: (a) the student's annual grade point average (gpa) will be based on all courses taken in the academic year (September - April) with a minimum of 30 credit hours; (b) to be eligible students must have a minimum annual gpa of 3.5; (c) awards will be made to students on a competitive basis, based on the highest annual gpa; (d) in cases where the annual gpa's are equal, the cumulative gpa will be used as a deciding factor;
- 2) In the year in which the scholarship is held: (a) the students will be enrolled full-time for the academic year; (b) the students will hold no other major university award; (c) the students are in an undergraduate degree programme, pursuing their first degree; (d) within the 100 awards, there are 7 scholarships reserved only for continuing students who are enrolled full-time in their second undergraduate degree programme (e.g. BEd, BSW).

Dr. Desmond Pacey French Scholarship

Value: \$250. One scholarship to be awarded annually to a full-time university student entering the first level of the French Immersion programme. B. Bursaries and Loans

Student Loans

1. Canada Student Loan – A loan, repayable with interest, funded by the Federal Government and administered by the New Brunswick Department of Advanced Education and Labour. To be eligible for this assistance, you must be enrolled in a minimum of 60% of a full-time course load. (See 5.o)
2. New Brunswick Student Loan – A loan, repayable with interest, funded by the Province of New Brunswick. You may qualify for this assistance if the Canada student Loan does not fully cover your costs and you are enrolled in a minimum of 60% of a full-time course load.
3. New Brunswick Bursary - A non-repayable grant. You must first qualify for the maximum amount available through Canada and New Brunswick Student Loans. The amount of the bursary differs depending upon your marital status and number of dependents. To qualify, you must be registered in a minimum 80% of a full-time course load.
4. In order for students to take full advantage of the total student aid programme (Canada Loan, New Brunswick Loan, New Brunswick Bursary), they must be registered in a minimum of 60% of a full-time course load (3 out of 5 classes) – in both semesters.
5. St. Thomas Student Aid Office – The Student Aid Office at St. Thomas is in the Registrar's Office, George Martin Hall. Applications for full and part-time students are available. Information and assistance available to all students.
